**Galactick Ensemble**'s co-founders - Mathieu Bleton, Mosi Espinoza, Jonas Julliand, Karim Messaoudi and Cyril Pernot met at France's national circus school at Rosny sous Bois before going their separate ways to establish new or join existing theatre-circus companies. Between them they have worked with several of France's leading contemporary circus creators including Aurélien Bory, Mathurin Bolze and Yoann Bourgeois whose productions have regularly featured at the Mime Festival at the Barbican, Southbank Centre and Sadler's Wells. Optraken premiered in 2017 and has since toured extensively in France, Belgium and Holland.

## Artists' note

"More than the circus itself, our starting point is a current reflection on man and his relationship to a hostile environment.

Our approach to making the show comes from a shared desire to stage simple human actions. 'Problems' like standing, speaking, gesturing, resisting or adapting to an external physical force are for us the vectors of forces which underlie many existential questions. This is how we developed situational acrobatics – this direct and concrete relationship between a rugged environment and the ability of humans to adjust to it. Our approach consists of bringing the individual and the group into play when faced with a real, unpredictable, risky situation. We aim to create pieces through which movement doesn't appear as acquired know-how, but as necessary to deal with different situations. The quality of the movement we look for is measured by its ability to create a breakthrough in the real world and to question the viewer."
